### Kalaheo's Christine Snyder to be Honored at Planting

Ralaheo's own Christine Snyder, killed Sept. 11 in the terrorist downing of a plane in Pennsylvania, will be memorialized at a tree planting in Honolulu's Ala Moana Park at Magic Island on Saturday, Nov. 10 at 8:00 AM.

Christine, a 1987 graduate, was Project Manager for the Outdoor Circle which is cosponsoring the event with Honolulu's Department of Parks and Recreation Division of Urban Forestry.

The tree planting will include a blessing, entertainment, participation by students and government officials, and the planting and mulching of about 65 new trees on the island. Many mature coconut palms will be planted along with milo, beach heliotrope and wiliwili trees.

Planting volunteers include Outdoor Circle members, Kalaheo High School students, as well as those from other Oahu schools, and Sales Associates from the Eddie Bauer store at Ala Moana Center.

Christine started at The Outdoor Circle a little more than six years ago and became its first Certified Arborist. She had a great deal to do with beautification efforts all over the state and was respected by those in her profession not only for her knowledge, but also for her total commitment to The Outdoor Circle's mission to keep Hawaii "clean, green and beautiful."

She was returning home from an urban forestry conference in Washington D.C. when the plane crashed.

Christine had recently married Ian Pescaia, a 1984 Kalaheo graduate.



Grads Night at Haleiwa Joe's in Kaneohe featured pupus, drinks and music under the stars.


Couples Night offered a buffet and dancing at the Elks Club in Waikiki.



# Remembering the Way We Were

## 1979 Time Capsule Resurrected

Thanks to a reminder from former head custodian **Rikichi Kohatsu**, the time capsule buried in 1979 near the gym was resurrected in January 2001. Although many items in the blue metal box are made of paper and waterdamaged, they provide a glimpse of "the way we were."

The program for the gym groundbreaking ceremony on October 1978 listed **Rosemarie Warriner** as principal. There was prayer in public school when **Dr. Ford Coffman**, **Kathy Coffman's** dad, gave the invocation and blessing at the event. Kalaheo's band *and* chorus also participated.

The staff of the October 13, 1979, student newspaper, *Ka Leo O Kalaheo*, included the following students, identified by their current professions: **Peggy Jenkins**, a Honolulu attorney; **Bryan Broadbent**, a physician; and **Kate Tullis**, a medical researcher. In this issue, KGB (Kalaheo Governing Board) Director **Matt Murphy** reported on student activities; Matt is now in management with Matson Navigation. Kalaheo's current principal, **Dr. James L. Schlosser**, was the newspaper advisor.

A student-drawn cartoon in the discipline policy booklet clearly illustrated that paddling was then in vogue.

Tracy Turner's science fiction tale—"The End, the Story of

the World's Last Fuel Supplies"—concludes with "a new Dark Age."

The voices of foreign language students—including **Mike Metzger**, **Prisca Clark**, **Cora Hiroshige**, and **Bruce Voss**, a Honolulu attorney and Foundation board member—were immortalized on a reel-to-reel audiotape. Unfortunately, Kalaheo's reel-to-reel tape players no longer work.

Sporting event ribbons and badges urged us to "Go, Mustangs!" and "Wallup Waipahu!"

What did present-day Mustangs learn from these ancient artifacts? Don't bury paper!!


