

Foundation grant and computer fundraising support school technology goals

K alaheo's yearbook class will produce next year's annual on two brand new eMacs. Downstairs in the library, additional access to the computer catalog, online resources, word processing and other software will be available on two new Dell PCs.

A \$5000 Foundation grant will purchase these computers and also launches our "Computers for Kalaheo" fundraising campaign to support the school's immediate goal to improve campus technology.

Yearbook: Real World Experience

Yearbook advisor Becky Kam-Locasio expressed total surprise and excitement when she received grant funds. "Right now, the yearbook room has only two functional computers which are over five years old and with SCUSI ports!"

With the new computers, yearbook students will no longer tie up lab computers needed by others. They will learn *Pagemaker* and *Yeartech* on computers totally dedicated to

yearbook production.

"These eMacs will allow us to keep up with state-of-theart technology, such as CDs and digital photos," said the advisor.

The yearbook class receives no funds from the state. The

yearbook must pay for itself and the staff sells advertisements, senior quotes and signatures, hoping to at least break even.

"We are probably the most 'real world' class on campus; we create, design and improve a product, then market it at the end of the school year," said Kam-Locasio. "Mahalo for Foundation support of the yearbook class!"

Library Technology: Always In

Demand

"Students are waiting to enter the library at 7:30 every morning," said librarian Martha Robertson, "and many head straight for the computers to write or print a paper, research online, or locate library resources."

The new computers will be loaded up with resources, including encyclopedias and other software the older computers can't handle. "Potentially, every single student in the school will benefit from this Foundation grant. Our computers are in high demand because we're open every minute of almost every school day."

The library experienced a budget crunch this school year, primarily because a new server and two new circulation stations had to be purchased for a major upgrade of the automated catalog-circulation software.

"That's the program patrons use to search the computer catalog by author, subject, or title. Yep, all those catalog cards have gone to recycle heaven," said Robertson.

"We love what computers can do for us, but don't forget to read good books!"

Schoolwide Technology

One of the five Kalaheo Schoolwide Learner Outcomes is that students will become "technologically literate learners who competently use a variety of technologies and appropriately select and apply technologies to learning experiences."

A major and immediate priority is to "increase technology literacy to support a standards-based education."

For several years, the school has been building the infrastructure to support computer technology—installing conduit, laying wire, and purchasing computers when buildings are wired. As the networking project nears completion, more and more classroom computers will be needed.

With the help of alumni, parents and other members of the community, the Kalaheo Foundation will continue to support the school's technology goals.


