What is the Kalāheo High School Foundation and Alumni Association?

The Kalāheo High School Foundation was established in 1992-1993 with a mission to provide a permanent funding source for promoting student achievement and academic excellence at the school.

An independent board of directors administers a charitable trust and encourages donations to an endowment which will provide ongoing support to Kalāheo's students and staff.

Interestingly, the seed money to establish the Foundation was provided by the Kalāheo faculty. When Kalāheo was designated a National Blue Ribbon School in 1991, teachers elected to use the \$4000 award to start a non-profit organization that would benefit the school in perpetuity.

Over the years, alumni became increasingly involved in the

Foundation as board members and as organizers of reunions and community events. Currently, over half of our board members are alumni.

The Foundation Board warmly welcomes returning and newly-arrived students, parents, faculty, and staff to Kalāheo's large extended family which includes approximately 9000 alumni.
