A reception honoring 1995 alumnus and dramatic baritone **Jordan Shanahan** was held on December 12, 2019, at a Waimanalo beach house under balmy skies and an almost full moon.

Since Jordan was selected for the honor over two years ago, the Board was delighted to learn he would be home for a brief visit and to quickly arrange a potluck pupu reception attended by 30 alumni, teachers, Board members, friends, family, and other members of the community.



Jordan was presented a Pyramid of Excellence, and his photo will join nine others on the History and Pride Wall in the school office.



When Jordan was a Kalaheo student, he played trombone in the school band and, at age 17, was named principal trombonist with the Honolulu Youth Symphony.

His singing talents were first discovered when, intending to audition for the orchestra for a Ron Bright musical production at Castle High School, he was asked to audition for a singing part and won the lead role of Emile de Becque in Rodgers and Hammerstein's South Pacific.

At UH Manoa, Jordan studied Trombone and Composition before focusing on singing. With a full scholarship, he moved to Philadelphia to study Opera Performance at Temple University and later joined Opera Studio Nederland and the Ryan Center at Lyric Opera Chicago.

He has performed over 70 major roles in opera theaters around the world including The Metropolitan Opera. On the concert stage, Jordan has performed an equally wide-ranging repertoire and received critical acclaim at Carnegie Hall and also in Budapest, Amsterdam and with other major orchestras across Europe and the U.S.

Jordan now lives in Switzerland and performs regularly in Europe, North America, Asia and, of course, in Hawai'i.
